For four generations the Tribaut Family has maintained their passion and expertise to produce impressively delicate and refined Champagnes. The family proudly runs their vineyards and winery situated in the lovely village of Romery, between the Vallée de la Marne and the Montagne de Reims. Romery is lying next to Hautvillers, the birth place of Champagne.

The family-owned vineyards mainly lie in the communes of Romery, Cormoyeux and Fleury la Rivière. Their south and southeast-facing slopes with clay-limestone soils, located within a remote valley of the Marne backing on to the Montagne de Reims, enable the production of some outstanding Meuniers and some very surprising Chardonnays. They also grow vines in the commune of Aÿ, a Grand Cru village in the famous Vallée de la Marne, celebrated for its Pinot Noir grapes.

Tribaut nowadays produces 500.000 bottles a year, every single one of them maturing for a minimum of 30 months in their underground chalk cellars, where the temperature will naturally remain steady at a temperature of 12°C all year round.

All of their Champagnes have won numerous awards and are renowned in many European countries. For this reason, we are proud to make Tribaut available for all South African bubbly connoisseurs and lovers.
